#### **Hunger in Sun City Center**

Working on the ambulance or van, many of us have the opportunity to see how some of our local residents may be going hungry. Even those of us not having direct patient contact probably know or suspect that some of our neighbors are not eating as much or as often as they should to maintain their health.



There are numerous ways that we as an organization might serve as part of the solution. Food drives, making note of "possibly hungry" homes when we respond to a call, leaving a list of local food pantries and meal sites are just a few of the possible ways.

But the first thing we need to do is raise our own awareness and educate ourselves to the possible solutions. Several recent articles in local papers have highlighted the fact that Sun City Center and the surrounding community have a significant number of people who struggle to keep food on the table. This is shown in the Hunger Map below.

While we have food assistance programs in our community, most seniors are either embarrassed to seek assistance or feel guilty that they may be taking something from others. We also encounter cases where declining mental abilities affect a senior's ability to fix a meal or shop for food.
