From the Desk of the Chief

First, let me take this opportunity to thank everyone for all the hard work they continue to do. Most come in do their job without fanfare or recognition. Some positions don't get much notice for instance; radio or wheelchair maintenance as well as our sanitizing crew.

But there are also other groups of people on the Squad that do multiple functions for the squad along with their jobs on their teams. These people take on additional duties on a daily basis and without them, we could not function. Their duties include, but are not limited to:

Board- These nine people that are elected to office each serve three year terms. They make and review policies, monitor investments, attend functions for the squad and meet at least on a monthly basis.

Comptroller/Treasurer- They strive to make sure we are financially secure, pay bills, handle the fund drive, as well as keep and monitor accounts payable.

HIPPA/Compliance- Linda Blume has a duel role in that she directly reports to the board on HIPPA issues, but also reviews every run report to ensure accuracy before sending them to the state.

Education- As we train all of our own people (except EMTs) and recertify them, this requires a large number of instructors in many different areas.

Human Resources – Every person on the Squad is interviewed and has a background check. Along with all the paperwork to go along with it, they also maintain all personnel files. In addition, this group of people organize and attend the monthly recruiting meetings with the objective of obtaining new members for our team.

Communications – This is a large group of people who see that all information relative to the squad gets reported accurately through our various lines communications in Sun City Center. In addition, they attend the orientation meetings to familiarize new residents of our presence within our community. They also attend various city functions, such as the annual Fun Fest, often providing blood pressures checks, distribute our vials of life and promote general good will throughout the City.

Safety – Along with constantly monitoring each building, he reviews any accidents or incidents.

IT- This is a technical area that I believe people don't notice much until something doesn't work.

Purchasing- Rick Frabotta reviews all contracts and ensures we have the supplies we need.

This, by no means, is meant to be a complete list of their areas of expertise within our squad, but to show iit really does take a Village.

HYPERTHERMIA VS. HYPOTHERMIA

Hypothermia

Hypothermia is defined by the Mayo Clinic as "a medical emergency that occurs when the body loses heat faster than it can produce heat, causing a dangerously low body core temperature, classified as body core temperature passing below 95 degrees F (35 degrees C)." Body shakes, cold or cool to touch, slurred speech, confusion and drowsiness are among this list of symptoms.

Do we really have to be too concerned about heat loss here in the Sunshine State? You bet. Even though it's a scorcher outside, our core temperatures can get below standards. Swimming too long in our 90 degrees F Gulf waters or the heated pool is enough to do it. Lying on a cool tile floor; perhaps, after a fall for too long can do it. (We've all seen or heard of a patient not getting help for many hours after a fall) as well as sitting in direct cold air are just a few causes. Each situation seeping and dissipating precious body heat.

If necessary, I have a list of facilities. We use Lights and Sirens when responding to ambulance calls (911) and do **Medical Trans**not down-grade. ports are FROM HOSPITAL ONLY. A Fall is a Fall and requires a trauma alert filled out and, of course, do not forget all falls require a Blood Falls include lift assist. Sugar. OBTW a complete set of vitals is required on all patients including GCS and repeated every 15 minutes. We do not use Prior vitals as if we took them. We must do a set of our own vitals. OIF falls require a head-totoe exam and charted. [AFYADAG] Hope you are picking up the hints-if not, IWSIOFY. **Abbreviations are** great but please approved ones. Ones that you will remember if called to court or a teammate asks "What do you mean?" Thank you for all you do! You are so very appreciated and needed. If you have questions, just ask.
