We are seeing some minor errors in regards to a Facility vs a Block Address. It appears that some of you aren't sure of the difference between the two. If you are going to a Facility, it will be listed under the Facility on the Incident Tab. Block address you have to type in a Street



Number and Find the Street. So what!! Facilities are licensed by the State as a Healthcare Unit. They have to meet certain requirements to be considered. It also means that if a patient is a single entity, they can be discharged to a Healthcare Facility vs going home alone to a Street Address.
